## How to Measure Your Ring Size Using a String

## Step 1

Cut a piece of string at least 3 inches long ( or a strip pf paper)


## Step 2

Wrap it around your finger at the base of the knuckle or use a pen to mark where the two ends overlap


## Step 3

Lay the string (or paper strip) flat and use a ruler to measure the length in millimeters

## How to Measure Your Ring Using Our Printable Ring Sizer

## Step 1

Cut out the strip and cut a slit along the dotted line.


## Step 3

Slip the paper band onto your finger and pull the tab until it fits snugly.


## Step 2

Wrap the ring sizer, numbers facing outward, in a circle and slide the smaller end through the slit.


## Step 4

The number that shows up next to the arrow is your ring size.
